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For the attention of all upper secondary pupils!

As you will be aware, the spread of COVID-19 has increased in our region and we have all received stricter recommendations that we must follow in order to help reduce the spread of infection. All training is cancelled, all social events such as parties etc. shall be avoided and going to the shops and other public spaces shall be limited.

Some classes will be held remotely

The spread of infection is also affecting the schools, and to make sure we do not end up in the same situation we had this spring, Kunskapsförbundet has decided that the upper secondary schools shall hold some classes remotely. This decision is valid until 19 November, and may be extended.

Remote classes will not apply to all pupils – the schools will remain open and most pupils will attend school almost as usual, but certain groups will have remote classes for all or parts of the school day. The system used at the three different upper secondary schools under Kunskapsförbundet will differ, depending on the school buildings.

This will make it easier for pupils to keep their distance and will reduce crowding in the schools, but will also help society in general as it will reduce the number of people taking public transport and in public places.

More information from your mentor

If you are one of the pupils who will be taking remote classes, your mentor will provide you with all the information you need. You can also find this information on ItsLearning and the school's website.

Important things you have to do now:

- Go in to ItsLearning and the school's website every day to check for any changes.
- Bring your computer and charger home with you every day. You may need them if a new decision is made.
- Bring other school materials home with you every day, such as books and other items you need for your studies.

Information will also be published on ItsLearning and the school's website, and this can be good to have if you need help with anything when taking remote classes. The pupil health service and IT supervisors can provide support if you have any problems with your computer or need a little extra inspiration or support with your studies.

And then we want to repeat the same things we have been saying for some time now

We know that the remote classes this spring were difficult for many of you. We are therefore doing everything we can to avoid going back to the same situation again.

Together, we can stop the spread of this infection so that we can go back to living our normal lives. This is what we are all hoping for.

But first, we all have to help to stop the spread.

We know that you already know this, but want to remind you anyway:

- Stay at home if you have even the slightest symptoms. Take a test.
- Wash your hands.
- Cycle or walk to school if possible.
- Keep your distance!
